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Imprimis I give unto my eldest son Anthony Welden all the
 furniture of what kind or nature soever and household goods
 China and all my household dinner for bed and board plate
 Irons pictures and glasses as they now stand and are in my
 house at Well aforesaid Item I will that my daughter Mary
 shall have the thousand pounds given her by her father's
 will under some conditions as therein mentioned which
 conditions tho' not performed I acquit and discharge her of and
 am willing to dispense with I also give unto my said daughter
 Mary seven hundred pound more and forgive her husband
 and son Griffin what ever he owes me on any account
 what so ever provided my said son Griffin do upon receipt
 of the said seven hundred pounds and acquittall from the
 sett he owes me which I reckon is above an hundred pounds
 settle an estate in lands to the yearly value of two hundred
 pounds upon my said daughter for life in case she survive
 him and after their deceases to the use of the issues of their
 two bodies under such uses limitations and proportions as
 my Trustees hereinafter named or the Survivor of them
 shall think requisite and convenient to direct appoint
 or my said Trustees or the Survivor of them and my said son
 Griffin shall think fitt to agree upon Item I give unto my
 son George Welden eight hundred pounds to be paid unto
 him at the age of one and twenty years and in the mean
 time the interest thereof to be paid unto him for his
 maintenance and education Item I give unto my said son
 George more two hundred pounds to be paid unto him after
 the death of my sister Susanna Wolley Item I give unto my
 youngest son Jeremy Welden eight hundred pounds to be paid
 unto him at his age of one and twenty years and in the
 mean time the interest thereof to be paid unto him for his
 maintenance and education Item I give unto my said son
 Jeremy more two hundred pounds to be paid unto him after
 the death of my said sister Wolley Item I do give unto my
 said daughter Griffin more two hundred pounds to be paid
 unto her after the death of my said sister Wolley Item I give
 unto my said sister Wolley the sume of one hundred pounds
 to receive the same within one year after my decease Item
 I give unto my said sister my last India black Gilt railed
 dressing Maria Item I give unto my said sister the interest of
 six hundred pounds during her life which said six hundred
 pounds I will shall be placed in the hands of my Trustees
 herein after named to be by them putt out to interest for
 that purpose and the principall sume to be paid unto my
 daughter Griffin my son George and son Jeremy after my
 said sister's death it being the money my will is that shall be
 for the payment of the said two hundred to each of my said
 children after my said sister's death as before mentioned Item
 I give unto my said sister Wolley all my wearing Apparell
 both Wollen dinner silke or any other kind together with
 all my dinner Wollen silkes Callicoes and other things
 made up of that kind Item I will and desire my said son

Sister shall live at my house in Well aforesaid to manage
 my sons estate and to receive the rents and profits thereof
 and to let and dispose of the same whilst his return for which
 and for keeping house I desire she may be allowed forty pounds a
 year out of the estate Item my will is that if it happen that
 any of my said children should ~~any~~ die before their
 respective ages on which their said several legacies become
 payable that then the legacy of such Child or Children shall
 go to the survivor or survivors of them my will notwithstanding
 is that if my Trustees shall think that the payment of the
 said portions to my said Children or any of them before their
 attaining their or any of their several ages on which the same
 is heretofore appointed will be for their advantage that it shall
 and may be lawful for my said Trustees to advance and pay
 the same or by such sumes parts thereof as to them shall seem
 proper and convenient Item I will that all the money and
 portions given to my said Children shall be paid into the
 hands of my said Trustees Item I nominate and appoint
 John Masingford and Charles Dainton Trustees of this my
 will Item I give unto my said Trustees five guineas apiece
 and I will that they may detain and keep in their hands
 what money they shall expend in the execution of the said
 trust Item my will is that my watch and Jewells shall be sold
 for raising money for the performant of my will Item I give

 I will that my Coaches horses and furniture shall be sold Item I
 make my loving sister Susanna Dainton whole and sole executrix
 of this my will and I desire that after she has paid all my
 debts and legacies and discharged my funeral expenses that
 the surplus of the money in her hands (if any be) shall be
 equally divided amongst my said executrix and my said children
 in witness whereof I have this four and twentieth day of July
 Anno Domini 1717 set my hand to the two first sheets of this
 my will and my hand and seal to the third and last sheet
